#### **ENTRY CONDITIONS**

- This award is open to final-year undergraduate engineering students who are current Student Members of Engineering New Zealand. The students must be studying for an Engineering New Zealand-accredited qualification in 2019.
- The award is open to students in all fields of engineering. Projects may be design-only projects or final-year research projects where the aim is to design, build and demonstrate a new or improved device.
- A maximum of five entries in total can be put forward from any tertiary provider, with preferably no more than two entries per engineering discipline.
- Judges have the discretion not to make an award if required standards are not reached or criteria are not met.

### **JUDGING CRITERIA**

To be considered for the award, your project must demonstrate the following:

- Clear specification of requirements and constraints
- · Identification and preliminary evaluation of potential solutions
- · Technical analysis of one or more preferred options
- Evaluation of a preferred solution against the requirements and constraints
- · Consideration of social, environmental and economic impacts
- Quality of presentation and its communication of ideas.

Judges also look at innovation in design solutions and for evidence that design has been used as a creative activity. The criteria do not carry equal weight.

#### **NOMINATION CHECKLIST**

- ✓ Completed nomination form
- Copy of the students' project as submitted for assessment. This project must have been submitted to a tertiary education provider as part of the final-year requirements for an Engineering New Zealand-accredited qualification in 209
- Statement of academic requirements and learning outcomes in the paper for which the project was submitted
- Poster or short report summarising the project and addressing the judging criteria

We'd also appreciate any high-resolution photographs of the project team for use in promotional material. Photos should be 300dpi, full-colour .jpegs, and supplied with a caption.

Nominations must be received by 5pm 3 February 2020. The award will be presented to the successful candidate(s) at the Fellows' Dinner in Wellington on 27 March 2020
