

# Knowledge Assessment Checklist & resources

CPEng NZ registration requires a Washington Accord accredited qualification or equivalent. If you don't hold one, you'll need to complete a Knowledge Assessment to show your knowledge is at Washington Accord level.

Immigration NZ may ask you to provide a letter certifying that your degree/s and any further learning meet the benchmark requirements for Chartered Professional Engineer status. We can provide you with this letter once you have successfully completed the Knowledge Assessment.

Please note, the Knowledge Assessment is separate from the CPEng first-time assessment.
